- It was with a humble dignity that the fireman collected his award for bravery.

**Thursday – Harbour** (verb) - keep (a thought or feeling, typically a negative one) in one's mind, especially secretly; or (noun) - a place on the coast where ships may moor in shelter, especially one protected from rough water by piers:

- Jenny could not help but harbour a great affection for her first love.
- In January of 1502, Portuguese explorers landed at a **harbour** on the coast of South America, and named the site Rio de Janeiro, meaning River of January.

**Friday – Synchronise** (verb) - cause to occur or operate at the same time or rate:

- Soldiers used their watches to synchronise attacks.
- To avoid confusion, we will synchronise all the clocks in the office.
