WORDS OF THE WEEK

- The aircraft was loaded with incendiaries.

Tuesday – Ambivalent – Adjective: Having mixed feelings or contradictory ideas about something or someone:

Wednesday – Uncanny – Adjective: Strange or mysterious, especially in an unsettling way; difficult or impossible to explain:
